



Guided walking tour – Literary Prague

(Registration for this activity is available via the conference registration form.)

Discover Prague through the lives and works of writers who helped shape Czech culture, thought, and political life. This guided walk takes you through the historic streets and cafés where literature, ideas, and civic engagement intersected — and where many influential authors lived, wrote, met, and debated.

Along the way, we will visit places connected with figures such as **Franz Kafka, Arnošt Lustig, Karel Čapek, Jaroslav Seifert, Václav Havel, Bohumil Hrabal** and, even **Dan Brown**, whose work later drew global attention to Prague's literary and historical landscape.

Route highlights

Mariánské náměstí (Marian Square) → Klementinum → Široká Street → Spanish Synagogue → Franz Kafka Square → Old Town Square →
U Kamenného beránka (*At the Stone Lamb*) → Melantrichova Street → U Dvou zlatých medvědů (*At the Two Golden Bears*) → Husova Street →
U Zlatého tygra (*At the Golden Tiger*) → Perštýn → Franz Kafka's Head → Národní třída (Café Louvre, Reduta, Národní kavárna) →
Václav Havel Square → Slavia Café → (*depending on time*) Ostrovní Street & Václav Havel Library.

For groups of **20–25 participants**, the use of **headsets is recommended**.

Headsets can be rented on site at a cost of **CZK 45 per person** (approximately **€1.70**).
